Dear Irvington resident,

One of the most important things that I can do as your Congressman is to work hard to bring Federal money back from Washington.

I recently obtained \$28,497 from the Department of Justice to help Irvington police prevent, respond to, and investigate crime. These funds will assist in making your community a better, safer place in which to live.

In my last letter to Irvington, I said that I was working on transportation funding legislation to make sure it would include funds for the RiverWalk project in Irvington.

I am happy to report that I was successful. The final transportation bill passed by Congress included \$200,000 for a feasibility study and preliminary design of Irvington's remaining part of the 42-mile Hudson RiverWalk project.

As you know, the RiverWalk project will create a new esplanade along the Hudson River, connecting the Ardsley-on-Hudson MTA Metro-North train station to the Scenic Hudson Waterfront Park. It will not only be part of the Hudson RiverWalk project, but also will make it easier for Irvington residents to use the Park.
